
PTO ELECTIONS!

START THIS SCHOOL YEAR RIGHT-READ ALOUD WITH YOUR CHILD! What's one simple thing you can do to help your child do better in school this year? Read aloud with your child often.

For very young children, reading aloud is a way to introduce the world of books. You can create happy memories and encourage your child to make reading a daily habit.

Research shows that even older kids love being read to. One study found that <u>all</u> elementary school children said they love having someone read to them.

Here are some tips to make your read-aloud time at home more successful: *MAKE READING ALOUD a priority. Plan for it. Set aside time for it and then just do it! *READ BOOKS YOU ENJOY. There's nothing worse than finding yourself with 100 pages to go in a book you can't stand. If you have any doubt you'll like a book, skim it before you start. *READ SOME BOOKS that are a little too hard for your child to read alone. These books are a great way to increase your child's vocabulary!
